Black Hawk/Warren “Future Warriors” 2026 Flag Football Program



The fall of 2026, the Black Hawk/Warren Warrior football program will continue to run a flag football program for our communities’ youth, both *boys* and *girls* are welcome to participate. The practices and games will all be on Saturday mornings starting September 5th through September 26th. We do not have a normal varsity schedule this season, which unfortunately impacts the flag football schedule this season.

Participants will be divided into 2 divisions by their grade for the fall of 2026: 2nd-3rd graders and 4th-6th graders. Each division will be coached by members of the Black Hawk/Warren football team and led by members of the Black Hawk/Warren coaching staff.

Participants will rotate through stations. The participants will learn fundamentals and techniques of position specific drills for offense and defense, as well as punting and kicking. The participants will then be divided into 2 teams by grade level division to learn plays to prepare for a flag football game. Then the participants will play a flag football game against the other grade level division team.

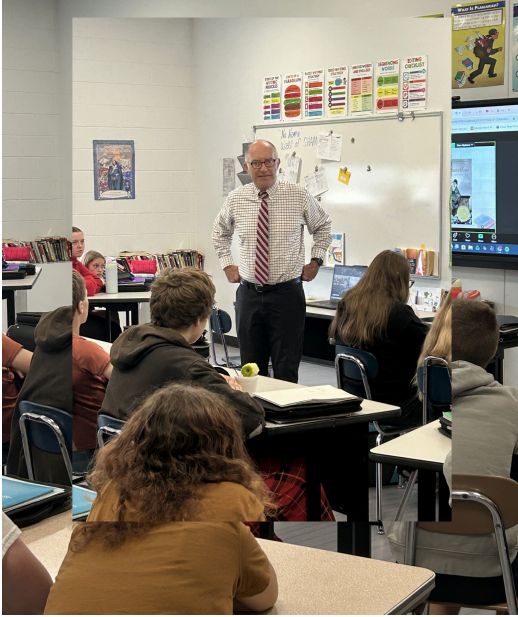

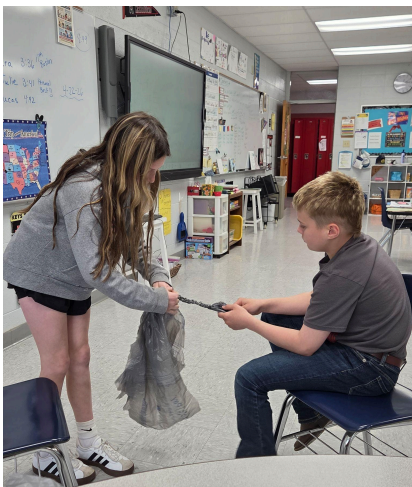

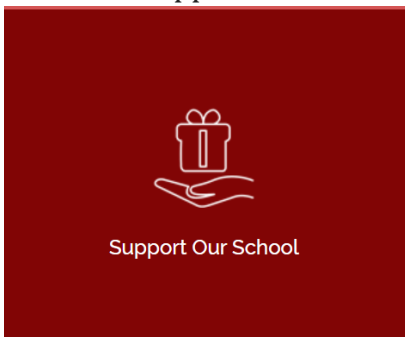

FEBRUARY 11, 2026



The meeting was called to order by President Dee Paulson at 6:53pm in the upper commons. The following members were present Dee Paulson, Jim Baumgartner, Mindy Stauffacher, Cali Schliem, Clayton Ruegsegger, Val Dunlavey and Jason Figi Also Present was Administration of Willy Chambers and Tammy Zimmerman and 14 Guest.

Motion by Baumgartner and seconded by Stauffacher to approve to consent to agenda which includes the financial report as presented: which includes checks written, ACH payments, journal entries, cash receipts, and the cash reconciliation for the prior month, posting of the agenda, minutes from the January 14, 2026 meeting, resignation of Assistant Basketball Coach Payton Calow, resignation of Elementary Teacher Brianna Hagen at the conclusion of the current school year, approval of volunteer Boys Basketball Coach Josh Lehman. It was noted that we will have to Amend the motion that was made on November 12, 2025, meeting for the FFA trip and not rescind it. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Administration Report: Chambers: The food service audit was yesterday and today. The two ladies, Jen and Karla, were very complimentary of the work done in the district. There were some very minimal compliance items that we will be correcting in the next two months. They said this was the smoothest and most compliant review they have done in years. Kudos to Rhonda, Dar, Melissa, and Tammy!

We received a total donation from Larry and Cali Lelle and Delta Airlines of \$10,000. Mr. Lelle has requested that it be directed towards STEM education.

Attached is an email from Tara Kammes, which includes the following paragraph:

Black Hawk had 2 students, Olive Akins and Clara Ruegsegger, place in our county contest held back in December. Olive got 1st, which meant she moved on to the area contest in January. She also placed 1st at the area contest and will be moving onto state which will be held in March. Clara placed 3rd which means she did not move on but did win prize money from the county.

Milz: No Report for Board

Erickson: Winter sports are winding down. In basketball, due to attrition to injuries as well as some other issues, both teams have had to cancel some JV games.

WIAA tournament has gone to an electronic seeding format so our teams have had a report and have a pretty good idea of where they will be traveling but it is still dependent on a few more games.

The wrestling teams have competed very well all year. The girls will wrestle at regionals on Friday, and the boys will wrestle in Sectionals on Saturday. The WIAA tournament has changed formats this season with the elimination of the regional format for boys.

Congratulations to Brigitte Stauffacher who finished 4th at the girl's mega conference meet. Also, to Evan Sigafus who was the conference champion at 126, Dax Paquin who finished runner-up at 215 and Maddox Hocking (a Shullsburg student/athlete) who finished runner-up at 285. All of the kids comped very well, and we've been pleased with the progress they have shown.

Along with Argyle we had posted the baseball coaching position and between the schools we received one person interested, Chuck Bredeson. He is being presented for approval at the Argyle School Board meeting tonight.

Preliminary numbers for track are high, and practice starts in less than a month. Baseball and Softball begin in just over a month.
